**From the Pastor.** The worship and ministry of the very first church is described in Acts 2:42-47. As a new church they were committed to spending time together, the study of the Scriptures, fellowship, gathering together, and meeting in each other's homes. They also spent much time in prayer. A main observance in the early church was to congregate in the temple courts and then gather in small groups to continue in the fellowship of the Lord. Early Christians used these small group gatherings to praise God and enjoy each other's presence. Small groups have been a critical component since the beginning of the church.

Our church today still depends on small groups in addition to our congregational worship. Sunday School is one of our main small group opportunities, providing Bible study and discipleship at all age levels. The weekly Men's Bible Study and Ladies Night are other activities that bring people together in a small group setting.

Creating small groups, outside of large group gatherings like our Sunday worship services, helps to build discipleship and a greater connection with others. Small groups lead to more discussion and deeper study. As a matter of fact, as a church gets bigger, it must also get smaller. Small groups lead to transformation, close friendships, learning about faith and becoming a people of prayer and study. In the next few weeks we will be introducing some new small-group opportunities.
